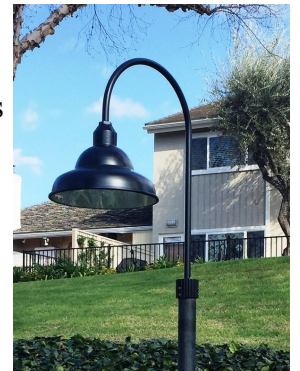

GREENBELT LIGHTING

ATTRACTIVE LAKESHORE LANDSCAPE

Have you increased the water for your plants? The upcoming months will continue to be hot and both you and your plants will require more water to look their best. Lakeshore's roses, lilies, geraniums, irises, daisies and grasses can be seen all over and they are glorious. But where did all those weeds come from? Some weeds are growing faster than the flowers. Please cut back any new growth that is getting out of control and tend to weeds soon. And remember to keep those bushes and plants from overhanging or encroaching onto the public sidewalks. We often see double-wide baby strollers and groups of walkers that require almost the entire width of the sidewalk to avoid going off the curb. Please keep our sidewalks safe for walkers. Let's all help to keep Lakeshore safe and looking its best.



BROKEN SPRINKLERS

If you see a broken sprinkler in the common area as you're walking or driving through the neighborhood we ask that you call the office and report it. The irrigation runs in cycles and sometimes it remains undetected for a period of time. **So if you see an area with a broken sprinkler, please call it in to The Emmons Company at 805-413-1170.**



Also be sure to regularly check your own sprinklers for broken pipes or leaking.

ROSE BLOSSOM TIME

This has been an ideal year for Lakeshore's many colorful and fragrant rose varieties. Our roses put on an amazing and dazzling display. We welcome all residents to cut a few rose blooms and take a beautiful bouquet back to your homes from the Association's plants on our attractive common areas. Please don't pick members roses from inside rear fences or front yards.



And remember to cut, don't break the stems. *You can also help us out by deadheading any spent blooms that you see close by.*

LEAF BLOWER RULES

Warm weather is here and more of us have our windows open during the day. The sound of leaf blowers and even worse their dust and fumes becomes a concern and can be a real nuisance. Please be sensitive to your neighbors when using leaf blowers.

Please remind your gardeners of the following rules and be sure to follow them yourself. Other HOAs have different rules so it is up to you to inform your gardener of the correct Lakeshore rules.

The City of Westlake Village guidelines for the use of leaf blowers, which Lakeshore currently observes, are as follows: Hours of Operation: Between the hours of 7:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday, and 8:00 am to 4:00 pm on Saturday.

- Hours of Operation: Between the hours of 7:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday, and 8:00 am to 4:00 pm on Saturday.
- No leaf blowers on Sundays or legal holidays.
- Do not blow debris onto neighboring property, common areas, or City streets. All debris must be cleaned from City streets and gutters immediately.
- Direct blowers away from the lake. Do not blow debris into lake under any circumstances.

NEWAMENDED RULE 3.5 Satellite Dishes and Antennas

3.5 Satellite Dishes and Antennas.



No antennas are allowed on the exterior of residences, except for satellite dishes, measuring one meter or smaller in diameter.

Choose an installation location least visible from the street and common area. Paint the dish and bracket arm to blend with the background using matte or flat finish, non-metallic paint. Never get paint on the attached "electronic eye," aka low-noise block feedhorn. Tuck or conceal all cable and wires from view.

Residents or the owner must remove any satellite dishes prior to vacating the premises.

All installation locations must be preapproved and signed off by the Architectural Committee prior to installation.
