TIME TO CHECK YOUR TREES

Take a moment to check the condition of your trees (front, back and side yards) if they are top heavy or overhanging onto the sidewalk, the street or your neighbor's yard it's time to trim them back. With the extreme weather temperature fluctuation we have been experiencing, the health of your tree's should be checked, you may also want to consult an arborist. Remember the Santa Ana winds will be starting soon, be sure to take the necessary precautions and trim your trees keeping your home safe and avoiding a potential liability.

STREET SWEEPING

Leaves are falling in Lakeshore and most of them will eventually end up on our lanes. Moving your cars off the roadway on Thursdays is especially important from now until the first of the year. We usually see the sweeper in Lakeshore every Thursday between 10 and 2 except for holidays when they sweep on Friday. If you have visitors or tradesmen please ask them to park in the driveway. If street parking is necessary please sweep the gutter debris to twenty feet ahead or behind the parked vehicle. Or just pick it up and put it in the trash. Any leaves or debris on our streets that can't be swept up will eventually end up in our lake. Thank you for helping to keep up Lakeshore's wonderfully pristine appearance. and keeping our lake healthy.
